


### A Year of Exciting Activities and Opportunities

Friends of Five Rivers experienced a full and exciting year in 2023, following our 50th anniversary in 2022.

Our education programs, the main focus of Friends of Five Rivers, were bursting at the seams. From our popular Guided School Program field groups, to the Maples program, our Talk & Trek programs, and our Beautiful Day and Summer Nature Week programming, we reached and introduced nature to hundreds of participants from age two to adults.

As for our activities and events, we had another very successful annual Fall Festival in September, and a new inaugural event, "Friends Celebrating Friends" at Glennpeter Jeweler's Glenmont location in

November, sprinkled with our fall and winter birdseed fundraisers, and Creative Nature Expressions art and photography exhibits.

Our Friends of Five Rivers Gift Shop income increased thanks to Volunteer of the Year, Laurie Keefe, and her team. Credit card sales via Square and Delmar Farmers Market sales contributed to this success of increased merchandise sales.

Friends Board members participated in several tabling events to help raise more awareness of our organization and mission, and we also became more actively involved with the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce. We love meeting our "Friends" at events!

We had four wonderful Naturalist interns, sponsored by the Friends, and many new Greeter volunteers. We are always

looking for new volunteers, especially Guided School Program instructors. Volunteering with us is a great way to get involved with our organization as we offer flexibility to meet your schedule.

Friends of Five Rivers also offered new ways for people to donate, with the introduction of our "Forever Friends" Memorial Pole plaques, and the ongoing opportunity to add a leaf to our Giving Tree. We also received a generous donation to upgrade and enhance the Goose Pond Road teaching site.

We are now looking to the future with a renewed focus on developing our endowment fund for long-term financial sustainability. We are also prioritizing our membership retention and growth. All this will ultimately benefit our mission of environmental education for young children, students, and adults.

### **Ending 2023 with Positive Growth for the Future**

Friends of Five Rivers experienced growth in numerous areas over the past several months. The achievements of 2023 can be attributed to a number of things, however, my words in the spring appeal from earlier in the year summarizes the key components to this success:

The gems of this invaluable treasure known as Five Rivers are the individuals, past and present, who sparkle with enthusiasm to maintain the 450 serene acres with its naturally carved trails amid forests and fields, thriving ponds, and exquisite wildlife... and the dedicated passion to educate young and old on the beauty of nature and all it can teach us.

It is indeed all those people mentioned who deserve a great deal of thanks for Friends of Five Rivers seeing growth this past year. In addition, the committed members of the Board of Directors and various committees pushed forward projects and programs to increase operating revenue all for the purpose of supporting our education programs. Our Giving Tree, unveiled in the fall of 2022, continued to grow with leaves. The "Forever Friends" Memorial Poles were installed offering plagues for people to remember their loved ones at Five Rivers. The popular birdseed sale was expanded to be held bi-annually. The familyfriendly Fall Festival drew more than 2,000 people, and finally, the inaugural "Friends Celebrating Friends" appetizer & auction event was very well received. We were also awarded several mini-grants to support our various projects, and received a generous contribution from the William Haaf family (pictured below) to help upgrade the Goose Pond Road Teaching site, making it both ADA accessible and generally more comfortable for students to access the pond for their scientific explorations. In addition, 2023 saw many other very kind donations from numerous supporters, with whom we are most grateful.

Our goal for 2024 is to expand the awareness of who we are and what we do... we are a small but mighty organization making impressive strides for environmental education and land preservation. We were recently awarded a Parks & Trails New York grant that will help us in achieving this goal of greater outreach. Please consider joining our efforts through your membership.

## **Educational Programs**

### **Devoted Guides - Hopeful Future**

Anticipation is an emotion that stems from hope. It is an expected emotion when trying something for the first time. Why then is there such palpable anticipation in the Guided School Program (GSP) prep room before each lesson? Why do instructors who have taught lessons for years still brim with anticipation? Because GSP instructors' hope for children and the environment is endless. They know sharing memorable experiences with children in nature is the key to beginning a lifelong connection with the environment.

In 2023, GSP instructors led 2,695 students and 810 adult chaperones to field, forest, stream, and pond habitats for meaningful lessons. Many of the children were on their first field trip and were full of their own anticipation. With their instructor's guidance, children pondered plant and animal life while using hand lenses. They observed and sketched unknown species. They lifted sap bucket lids and squealed with delight as their eyes caught droplets leaving the spile and splashing into the reservoir. Some moved from fear to curiosity to a tentative appreciation

after sweep netting for insects in the field. Most engaged with nature in a memorable way because a GSP instructor had hope and acted upon it.

Friends is indebted to the volunteer instructors who give their time, talents, and skills to the Guided School Program. Their anticipation of sharing memorable experiences in nature with children brings success to the program and, hopefully, to the conservation efforts of future generations.

#### **2023 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS**

The Guided School Program has recovered from low pandemic participation levels. Fall 2023 saw an increase of 225% in visitation over Fall 2022, placing the program at pre-Covid numbers. A total of 217 field groups containing 2,695 students and 810 chaperones headed out with GSP guides in 2023.

Numerous, greatly needed long-term projects came to completion this year. The updated Pond Life booklet was printed on waterproof paper thanks to an anonymous donor's gift. A learning-friendly teaching site was constructed at Goose Pond thanks to a donor's memorial gift. A GSP Welcome Video was created thanks to the tech savvy Friends of Five Rivers and Student Conservation Association interns. Each of the three projects enhanced the students' Five Rivers experience by allowing them to engage more fully in their study of nature!

## **Educational Programs**

### **Education Report Continued**

The excess of honey from onsite hives led to the creation of a sold-out Honey Tasting program for individuals and families. Participant feedback was overwhelmingly positive:

"The program was very informational, and all questions were answered in detail. The hands-on presentation was exceptional."

I most enjoyed "the discussion of honey bee biology and getting to open the honey comb. Interesting and fun!"

A total of 199 people took part in additional Friends' programming offered throughout the year. These programs included Membership Walks on the new Fisher Trail, Talk and Trek Continuing Education Series, Snow Snakes, Introduction to Honey Bees, and Sugar Mapling at Home.



### **SUMMER NATURE WEEKS**

Each day begins with the reading of a story from nature. Hands-on activities compliment the theme of the story and include exploration, discovery, games, and crafts.

These events and markets offer the opportunity to talk to our many existing Friends about programming, the trails, and all the amazing nature observed at Five Rivers. It's an opportunity to make new Friends and share the many great things about Five Rivers and all that it has to offer. Information is provided on memberships, programming, trails, hours of operation, etc. Believe it or not, there are people that don't know about Five Rivers!

At the Gift Shop, educational items and books for all ages are sold. This includes pocket guides, field quides, bug boxes, pond nets, eco-friendly items, and merchandise made with photos of the flora and fauna that can be found at Five Rivers. With the proceeds from all sales, the Gift Shop supports Friends and DEC's educational programming.

Increased promotion of Friends of Five Rivers merchandise through social media and participation at the Delmar Farmer's Market continues to raise awareness of our Gift Shop. Friends also purchased a Square terminal this year, so we can now accept credit card payment for all sales both at the Center and at Markets. Through expanded marketing initiatives, the ability to accept credit cards for all sales, and increased efforts of volunteers, the Gift Shop sales increased substantially in 2023!

Moving forward we hope to expand our eco-friendly offerings and increase our outreach to the community. ## **Financial Report**

### 2022-2023 Fiscal Year Remained Stable

The Friends' Financial Reports, including the IRS 2022 Return (Form 990) and the NYS Annual Financial Report for Charitable Organizations (CHAR500), are being prepared by an independent accountant, and will be available to the public when completed. The following is a draft summary of the Friends' financial performance for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2023, based on the preliminary figures provided by the accountant.

#### **OVERALL PICTURE**

Operational revenue increased and spending increased compared to the previous fiscal year, however expenses outpaced revenues by \$13,868. Overall, total revenue as will be reported in the IRS 990 increased from \$180,365 to \$208,249, while total spending increased from \$178,683 to \$222,117.

#### **BREAKDOWN OF OPERATING REVENUE**

The largest sources of operating revenue came from government grants of \$90,611 (44%). It was followed by non-government grants and contributions (including fundraising) of \$66,065 (32%), membership dues of \$21,646 (10%), program fees of \$22,975 (11%) and gift shop sales and other ancillary sources of \$6,952 (3%).

#### **BREAKDOWN OF SPENDING**

Program expenses of \$145,659 accounting for nearly 66% of total spending, was the largest area of spending and a \$30,270 increase from the prior year. Fundraising expenses at 20% accounted for the second largest area of spending at \$43,519, a minor increase over the \$43,191 (24%) spent on fund raising in the previous year. Management and administration of \$32,939 accounted for the remaining spending at nearly 15%.

#### **END OF YEAR ACCOUNT BALANCES**

Cash account balances on June 30, 2023, totaled \$194,908 compared to \$199,417 at the beginning of the year. Of the total assets, \$185,354 was restricted to a specific purpose either by the donor or by Board action and \$89,939 was unrestricted. Total net assets for the year decreased to \$275,293 from \$279,948 in the prior year.





# **Legacy & Endowment Giving**

### **Building Our Endowment Provides Stability**

We are all faced with choices about how to spend our annual income for both immediate needs (the checking account) versus how much to set aside for future spending (the savings account). Annual gifts are akin to making deposits into our checking account. Donations from our supporters average about \$75 per year each, and collectively, are critically important to sustaining our programs. However, contributions to the Endowment Fund (our savings account) would provide a gift in perpetuity.

A major benefit of an Endowment Fund is that it provides stability. It is a reliable source of money, which can be accurately estimated and incorporated into each year's annual budget plan with certainty. This is a great advantage for program planning because the bulk of our funds come from various grants, which are competitive, restricted in use, variable in amounts and duration, and expire.

The Friends of Five Rivers' Endowment Fund was created in 1995 and is managed by the Community Foundation of the Greater Capital Region. Their goal is to earn 7-8% annually through conservatively managed investments, and the earnings (minus fees) are re-invested back into our Endowment Fund. Each year, four percent of the total amount in the Endowment Fund is dispersed back to Friends to help meet our annual budgetary requirements for programs.

Currently, our Endowment Fund yields a small annual grant. But it still provides a track record on how powerful a gift to an endowment fund can be. Back in 1995, our Endowment Fund was created with \$5,250 and since then, it has not received any subsequent donations. Yet, each year, as the principal grows, so do its annual grants to Five Rivers. By 2023, the initial

investment of \$5,250 has doubled to approximately \$10,700, and this amount generated \$424 to support our annual budget. In sum, the Endowment Fund has provided total gifts over its life in excess of its initial investment. As of year end 2023, an initial investment of \$5,250 has returned to Five Rivers a total of \$6,592.

As the principal grows, so would the annual grant to Five Rivers from the Endowment Fund. For example, an Endowment Fund of \$50,000 would yield an annual grant of \$2,000, an amount which would be significant. In short, an endowment gift provides long-term sustainability for Friends of Five Rivers to help us maintain numerous educational programs and activities. In 2024, the Board members of Friends will be developing strategies to grow our Endowment Fund to a level which will yield a more substantial amount of money per year commensurate with current needs.

But why wait for us? Donations to the Friends of Five Rivers Endowment Fund can be made at anytime directly to Friends or to the Community Foundation, which manages our Fund. Other types of legacy gifts include retirement accounts, stocks and bonds, a bequest within your will, beneficiary designation of a life insurance policy, charitable trust, and more. We also have onsite capital projects that you may contribute towards to help advance our environmental education mission.
